The Antioch Church, as described in the Bible, is a model of a diverse, mission-oriented, and generous community. It was a central place for early Christian outreach, a symbol of unity among believers of different backgrounds, and a key player in the establishment of the global Christian movement. The leadership of the Antioch Church focused on teaching and worship, fellowship, sharing the Gospel, mentoring (**making disciples**), leadership development, and church planting. They spread the Gospel and planted churches throughout the First Century world, setting a powerful example for future Christian communities.

- II. How Will We Do This? Focus on Leadership Development [Deuteronomy 28:13]
 - A. Start our Leadership Academy (Saturdays beginning March 7, 2026)
 - B. Add a new value: A Bias for Action [Matt 11:12]
 - 1. Understanding The Kingdom of God: developing a Biblical Worldview [2 Tim 3:16-17] rooted in God's Love for us! [John 3:16-17; 2 Cor 3:6]
 - 2. "Ready, Fire, Aim" (repeat) [Prov 16:3,9]
 - 3. Honor 100% of My Commitments by the Power of the Holy Spirit [Zech 4:6]
 - C. Identify Short-Term Objectives (by SEPTEMBER 2026)
 - 1. Name Change that embodies our Life Journey and Mission [March 1, 2026]
 - 2. Start Six (6) New MiniChurches
 - 3. Assemble a Launch Team (ideally 100 people)
 - 4. Find a Sunday location in Kapolei
 - 5. Develop/Implement an Evangelism/Marketing Strategy; first event is "Whiskey & Jesus" March 21, 2026 6PM Kapolei (location tbd)
- III. Our New Name: Hope Chapel Kealapono [March 1, 2026] "hck"
 - A. Hope [Hebrews 6:19] "God is a Promise Keeper"
 - B. Chapel
 - 1. Smaller rooms in a church building utilized for intimate/interactive meetings
 - 2. Our church is a collection of chapels that we call MiniChurch (in-person and online, both local and global)
 - C. Hope Chapel: a name that reflects our Antioch heritage that Pastor John has been a part of since 1983 (Hope Chapel Kaneohe, first in Hawaii); Brenda Honold since 1979 (Hope Chapel Hermosa, founding church). Hope Chapel was started by Pastors Ralph & Ruby Moore in 1971. Their vision was to create a church that "equipped the saints to make disciples, reaching out to an unsaved world by the Power of the Holy Spirit" [Eph 4:11-12; Acts 2:42-47; Matt 28:18-20; Acts 1:8]. Focusing on MiniChurch and multiplication, the idea is that reaching an unsaved world is best achieved through planting healthy, reproductive churches. Key is everyone is a minister [1 Pe 2:9-12]
